Dear Parishioner,

It was good to see four (relatively!) young men standing up before the congregations at last Sunday's Masses and encouraging us all to do our bit to bring others to Christ and his Church. They deserve our prayers, our admiration and our support.

They asked you to meet them on Thursday. Your response to this request was so devastatingly disappointing that we will need to discuss it together. But despite Thursday's letdown they still ask you to take seriously your own responsibilities as members of the Church and to see if you can introduce someone to the Church by bringing them to the Come and See meeting on Thursday, 29 October, at

730pm at Stella Maris. Please do not let the Team down this time. This could be a life-changing experience for those you bring along.

Today is Mission Sunday, when we traditionally look to the needs of the Church in far off lands. We must always do this, for distance makes no difference to family membership, and we are all members of the Church, the Family of God. But more and more we are realising that the mission fields have shifted. Now they are here as well as there. Llandudno is as much (some would say more) a mission field as any part of Africa or Asia. What the Mission Team is trying to do for us is to make us deeply aware of this

and to act accordingly. What last Thursday showed is that we are still far from zealous in the cause of Christ's Church.

As you know, you can now listen to the Catechumenate Talks by going to our Website. Further to this, you can now listen to the Sunday homily there as well. This, I hope, will be a service to the sick who want to keep in touch with the parish family but who can't get to Sunday Mass. Simply click the link, "Sunday Homilies", at the top of the website

I have been putting leaflets at the back of the church for general collection, with a cover notice saying "Prepare Yourself Prayerfully for Next Sunday's Mass". Each week, more and more of these leaflets are taken. There are never any left over.

They take the prayers and reading of next Sunday's Mass and gently lead you through them, suggesting ways of making

them sources of prayer, reflection and meditation. By this they prepare you spiritually and mentally for the Sunday Mass, helping you to get the most out of it.

The leaflets are produced by Fr Damien Jackson SJ at St Beuno's and are sent, by email, to the four corners of the world, with the operation known as the "St Beuno's Outreach".

Many parishes have groups who come together weekly, using this material as a source of prayer and as a preparation for the coming Sunday's liturgy. We are going to start such a group on Thursday 3 December (the first week of Advent) and thereafter every Thursday at 730pm at Stella Maris.

Sr Mary Childs IBVM of our Convent is a member of the St Beuno's Outreach Team and will be leading the group. I am deeply grateful to her for her willingness to do this for us.
