Sunday reflections: 1st Sunday in Advent

At the start of this brand new Liturgical Year, we hear again the familiar clarion call of Advent, warning us to 'stay awake' as we prepare our hearts anew for the coming of our Saviour.

Living in a world that considers itself too enlightened to even acknowledge the existence of its Creator, never before has it been more important for us to take this call to heart. It is so easy for us to fall asleep spiritually without even realising it, in the same way that a fatigued driver succumbs to sleep at the wheel of a car, despite having every intention at the start of the journey of staying alert. We know from statistics that such incidents invariably result in fatality. So it is in the case of our souls unless they are constantly nourished and refreshed by personal prayer and the Church's life giving Sacraments.

The lighting of the first Advent Candle today is in asyfundraising many ways reminiscent of the flame of our Baptismal candle: a light of faith that in the first instance was entrusted to our parents and Godparents to be kept burning brightly. This has long become our own responsibility and especially so in a hostile spiritual climate such as ours where the cold winds of materialism do their utmost to extinguish the light of God within us.
