Mark 13:23-37

You, therefore, must be on your guard. I have given you full warning. 'But in those days after that time of distress, the sun will be darkened, the moon will not give its light, the stars will come falling out of the sky and the powers in the heavens will be shaken.

And then they will see the Son of man coming in the clouds with great power and glory. And then he will send the angels to gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the world to the ends of the sky.

Take the fig tree as a parable: as soon as its twigs grow supple and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near. So with you when you see these things happening: know that he is near, right at the gates. In truth I tell you, before this generation has passed away all these things will have taken place. Sky and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

'But as for that day or hour, nobody knows it, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son; no one but the Father. 'Be on your guard, stay awake, because you never know when the time will come. It is like a man travelling abroad: he has gone from his home, and left his servants in charge, each with his own work to do; and he has told the doorkeeper to stay awake. So stay awake, because you do not know when the master of the house is coming, evening, midnight, cockcrow or dawn; if he comes unexpectedly, he must not find you asleep.

And what I am saying to you I say to all: Stay awake!'

This week's reflection:

Did you see on the news this week the interview with Will Perry? You will remember him: he is one of our Paralympic Champion Swimmers, of whom we are justly proud. His disability is stunted growth. He spoke of his victorious return to Britain after the Paralympics, not in terms of laurel wreaths and congratulations, but as a continuation of that habitual ridicule he has endured every day of his life. He spoke of people pointing at him and photographing him in the streets, not as a returning hero as he was, but as some kind of oddity. Such behaviour speaks much more of our own sad loss of Christian values than of him.

Have you ever wondered what Christ looked like? Of course you have. We picture Him as sleek and athletic - but was He? He could have been tall or short, fat or thin - we just don't know. Neither the New Testament nor his contemporaries make any comment on his physique, or for that matter on anyone else's - except for one person, Zacchaeus (Luke 19). He is the man who famously climbed the sycamore tree to catch a glimpse of Jesus whom he could not see for the crowd because "he was small in stature" (Luke 19:3).

Could Zacchaeus have been suffering from dwarfism too? He well might have been, for Jesus always had eyes for those whom society marginalises. "And when Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, 'Zacchaeus, hurry and come down (from the tree) for I must stay at your house today". Jesus saw him simply as he was, not as a small man or a tall one, not as an upright man or a sinful one, not as a rich man or a poor one, not as anything at all other than Zacchaeus, a unique human being like everyone else. If we could only see people as Jesus did, Will Perry would not have had occasion for that interview.
