Continuation of Mark's Gospel: 4:1-9

Again he began to teach them by the lakeside, but such a huge crowd gathered round him that he got into a boat on the water and sat there. The whole crowd were at the lakeside on land. He taught them many things in parables, and in the course of his teaching he said to them, 'Listen! Imagine a sower going out to sow. Now it happened that, as he sowed, some of the seed fell on the edge of the path, and the birds came and ate it up. Some seed fell on rocky ground where it found little soil and at once sprang up, because there was no depth of earth; and when the sun came up it was scorched and, not having any roots, it withered away. Some seed fell into thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it, and it produced no crop. And some seeds fell into rich soil, grew tall and strong, and produced a good crop; the yield was thirty, sixty, even a hundredfold.' And he said, 'Anyone who has ears for listening should listen!'

Crowning of Our Lady

This weekend the children will crown the statue of our Lady. Catholics have long honored the Blessed Virgin Mary in May. Catholic churches create a dedicated area that includes a picture or statue of Mary, surrounded by flowers and candles. This remains throughout the entire month of May to memorialise the importance of our Mother Mary in Church and in our personal lives. During "May Crowning," we honor Mary as Mother of God and Queen of the Universe. In the medieval times, winter ended at the start of May because it was considered a time of new growth and beginnings. It was during this time that the "Tricesimum" ("30-Day Devotion to Mary" or "Lady Month") period began. That's when special devotions to the Mother of God started in May — spreading from Italy all around the world. It's important to note that we do not view Mary as a goddess, nor do we worship Mary; she is honored or venerated as the mother of Christ and Mother of God, the most important woman in our Catholic faith. She is the first to hold God within her and was conceived without the stain of original sin so as to be the perfect tabernacle of our Lord. She also holds a special place with her son and can intercede for us in a special way as shown in scripture. This is why we say "to Jesus through Mary."
