Gospel of John: 20:1-9

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

Gift Aid

Envelopes are now available in the Sacristy for those who have signed up to the Gift Aid scheme. Gift Aid is open to all Parishioners who pay tax, there is no extra charge for the scheme, and the gift aid will be taken care of by the Parish, though the amount you give over a Tax year must not be more than the tax you pay in that year, for example if you pay £1000 tax a year you must not give more than £1000 over the course of the year to the scheme.
